### Requirements to Be on Get Real Teen Council

You must:

- Be a 10<sup>th</sup>-, 11<sup>th</sup>-, or 12<sup>th</sup>-grade student at the start of the 2014/15 school year.
- Be interested in providing accurate sexual health information to your peers.
- Budget your time well and keep up with your academic work.
- Attend the mandatory three-day, overnight retreat which will be for a weekend in late August/early September. Exact date is TBD. (Note: it's free of charge).
- Commit to weekly meetings from 6:00-8:30pm.
- Miss some school to make presentations (about one day per month once presentations begin).
- Make Get Real Teen Council your extracurricular priority—over work, clubs, sports, etc. If you are doing
  more than one other extracurricular activity, ask yourself if you really have the time to commit to this
  program!
